#### Curfew for Household Still Enforced

We would like to remind everyone that household helpers are not allowed to enter and leave the village from 12:00midnight to 5:00a.m., unless there is a written authorization from their employers.

#### Parking at Closed Gate Barriers Not Allowed

Closed barrier gates should be free from any obstruction because these are used for emergency purposes, i.e. fire truck, ambulance, police, etc. Likewise, the garbage trucks use the gates when collecting the trash of the Village residents.

**Jumping over/going under closed gate barriers**

The act of going over and under the closed gate barriers in entering and leaving the village premises is strictly prohibited. The penalty of P1,000-fine is imposed per violator/incident.

**Please Refrain from Horn Blowing Inside the Village**

Please be advised that horn blowing is prohibited inside the Village from 10:00p.m. to 6:00a.m. of the following day, except to avoid accidents. Violators will be fined P100.00 per violation, non-payment of which will render them as members not in good standing.

We are, likewise, appealing to our residents to minimize horn blowing even during daytime in consideration of other residents who work in the evening and sleep during the day.

**Street Parking At Your Own Risk**

We would like to remind our Village residents that they are required to park their cars within their garages due to the narrowness of the village streets. Excess cars that cannot be accommodated in your garages MAY be parked in the immediate front of your residences, but not on the opposite side of the street.

**Residents not allowed to commandeer streets**

Residents are not allowed to commandeer streets through the installation of personal signs such as "No Trespassing" and "No Parking."
