**KIDNAP FOR RANSOM SEMINARS
CONDUCTED
AT BEL-AIR VILLAGE**

Due to the recent spate of kidnappings, the Association and Barangay Bel-Air sponsored separate seminars on kidnapping for the village residents and the household helpers, drivers, security guards, BAVA/Barangay employees.

The participants of the seminars were briefed by Mrs. Teresita Ang-See, a noted anti-crime advocate especially kidnapping and the officers of the Police Anti-Crime Emergency Response (PACER) about the modus operandi of the kidnap-for-ransom syndicates. Also discussed during the seminars were security measures which could be implemented both at home and at work.

BAVA/BRGY. ID = BENEFITS

We encourage our **village residents** to secure your BAVA/Brgy. Bel-Air ID so you could avail of the various benefits enjoyed by a holder of said IDs. Aside from access to the facilities of the Village, the BAVA ID will facilitate your entry into and exit from our Village even if you are riding in a car that does not have a BAVA/MIVA sticker. Also, if you wish to enter the pedestrian gate of Amapola/Aquarius gate (Gate 6) after its closing time at 12:30a.m. you may call the Security Office at 895-4011 and 896-5269 to accommodate your request. Just show your valid Bel-Air Village resident's ID.

In addition, you will be able to enjoy various services offered by Barangay Bel-Air including free medical and dental services, free ambulance service, assistance to apply for the Makati Health Card and Senior Citizen's card, among others.

The charge for the credit card type BAVA/Brgy. ID for village residents is P125.00 and is valid for one year from its issuance.
